- If in storage facility



- Use in AV [A-level] Option to scan [1 scanning workstation only]; print .10cents

Searching in Library Online Databases

- Check back for access to Paper of Records [Afro-American 1902-1978]
- Begin from Baltimore Newspaper Guide at <http://library.jhu.edu/researchhelp/baltimore/newspapers.html>
- Choose keywords
- **Truncate if necessary/ be cognizant of fields that are being searched**
- Consider using ethnic/ancestry group terms or focused issue terms [ESOL or multiculturalism]
- Consider using Ethnic/Ancstry Group terms
